Notice of Abandoned Property

Frank Swift loaned to the Southern Museum of Civil War & Locomotive History a telegraph sounder. The telegraph sounder is abandoned and will become the property of the Southern Museum if no person can prove ownership of it. Any person claiming ownership of the telegraph sounder must notify the Southern Museum in writing within sixty days of the publication of the last legal notice.

John Melton Hathaway loaned to the Southern Museum of Civil War & Locomotive History a Second National Confederate flag. The flag is abandoned and will become the property of the Southern Museum if no person can prove ownership of it. Any person claiming ownership of the flag must notify the Southern Museum in writing within sixty days of the publication of the last legal notice.

Bill McIntyre loaned to the Southern Museum of Civil War & Locomotive History four booklets on railroad history. The four booklets are abandoned and will become the property of the Southern Museum if no person can prove ownership of them. Any person claiming ownership of the booklets must notify the Southern Museum in writing within sixty days of the publication of the last legal notice.

Carolyn Peck loaned to the Southern Museum of Civil War & Locomotive History an 1851 Navy Colt revolver. The revolver is abandoned and will become the property of the Southern Museum if no person can prove ownership of it. Any person claiming ownership of the revolver must notify the Southern Museum in writing within sixty days of the publication of the last legal notice.
